

In March 2023 Lunchtime Recital, Victoria Wong played 'Introduction et rondo capriccioso' op 28 by Saint-Saens. It was a dazzling musical performance. I was delighted she accepted the invitation to perform again this year. On her own initiative, Victoria asked whether the program could involve her colleagues, Rachel Siu, 'cellist and pianist Marcel Mok. Multi award winners on various continents, each of them currently holds significant international music positions.

Their bios set the scene for a superb concert. This recital was world class. The Trio's profound musicianship shone through with beautiful tone and exquisite phrasing. The sensitive playing was sublime, particularly in the pianissimo passages of the third movement of the Brahms' trio, almost ghostly weaving lines.

Rachel's 'cello solos throughout the program were played with a captivating intensity, but with beautiful restraint when required. Victoria's accomplished violin playing, with a pure and singing tone, interwove so artistically in the playing of both trios.

In the final movement of the Brahms, Marcel's stunning playing conveyed the thrilling and dramatic atmosphere with a final swirling and thundering sound. A tour de force!

Without doubt, the audience was thrilled with every note of this recital. What a privilege to experience the music making of these outstanding young musicians. Thank you Victoria, Rachel and Marcel.

- (a) to receive the declarations of those persons then present
- (b) to determine whether a quorum is present
- (c) to elect a minute secretary

- (f) to elect 2 qualified persons to be wardens

THE BLACKET HOUSE TRUST

PROPOSAL BY THE TRUSTEES

TO BE PUT BEFORE THE RECTOR AND CONGREGATION OF ST PAUL'S CHURCH

AT A MEETING TO BE HELD IN THE CHURCH HALL ON 17 MARCH 2023 AT 12.00PM

Purpose

The purpose of the meeting is to obtain the consent of the Rector and Congregation to actions proposed by the trustees.

Background

Clause 20 of the Deed of Declaration of Trust provides:

The powers conferred on the trustees by this Deed shall not be exercised except with the consent of the Rector and Congregation, such consent to be sufficient if given by a majority of those members who are present at a meeting convened for the purpose held in the hall or other usual meeting place of the Rector and Congregation by a notice given to the Rector and Congregation on the two Sundays immediately preceding the day of such meeting in the manner in which announcements are usually made to the Rector and Congregation.

The trustees understand this clause to mean that, while they have the usual powers of trustees under the general law by virtue of their appointment as trustees (especially so that they may fulfil their duties under the law to administer the trusts and to preserve the trust property), they must obtain the consent of the Rector and Congregation for the exercise of the powers conferred specifically by the Deed, notably in relation to substantial projects and expenditures.

The trustees last sought and obtained consent from the Rector and Congregation at a meeting held on 26 March 2023. The consent obtained on that occasion included consent in relation to the payment of moneys to or for the Parish from the 2022 and 2023 income of the Trust. The trustees now propose to seek consent in relation to similar payments from any surplus of 2023 income and from the 2024 income of the Trust.

Proposed Resolution

The trustees ask the Rector and Congregation to pass the following resolution:

The Rector and Congregation consent to the following actions of the trustees of the Blacket House Trust ("the Trust"):

- 1. In addition to any amounts paid to or for the Parish from 2023 income of the Trust pursuant to the resolution of the Rector and Congregation passed on 26 March 2023 ("the 2023 Resolution") and after reservation of funds for the Trust's sinking fund, the trustees may pay to or for the Parish any surplus of 2023 income for purposes listed in the Schedule of Purposes in the 2023 Resolution.
- 2. Subject to the availability of funds derived from 2024 income, the trustees may expend up to 40% of the gross income of the Trust in 2024 on expenditures for the purposes listed in the Schedule below (being purposes for the benefit of the Rector and Congregation of St Paul's).


