The Advent Book Discussion Group on Zoom: The First Christmas

Advent Discussion Book: The First Christmas, What the Gospels Really Teach About Jesus's Birth by Borg and Crossan. The authors show how history has biased our reading of the nativity story as it appears in the Gospels of Matthew of Luke. They ask 'What do these stories mean from the perspective of the 1st and 21st centuries?' They show that the Christmas story, read in its original context is far richer and more challenging than people imagine.

The first Zoom meeting: 7pm Tuesday 12th November, and thereafter weekly each Tuesday night until the 17th December when will have a break for 3 weeks. We will resume meetings on Tuesday 14th January. The zoom sessions will take around 1 hour.
