Acts 4.32-37; Psalm 133; 1 John 1.1 – 2.2; John 20.19-31


On this Sunday some years ago, I celebrated the eucharist for Iranian Christians in a refugee detention centre. The doors were locked because we had been made afraid of them. This place of torture was de-

signed to keep out all signs of hope and compassion. But guards and razor wire could not keep the risen Lord out. Bread was broken Christ had risen and was present with the world's most vulnerable people.

Please note that the Parish Lunch, will be held on the second Sunday of the month.


